
- 1 x queen unit This unit has 1 queen bed tariff \$140 per night (It is really designed for 1 night as it has limited kitchen facilities toaster, Kettle and fridge. There is no view)
- 1 x queen superior studio Kitchenette, Queen bed and view of Mountains and sea. Tariff \$165 per night
- 4 x standard studios these have 1 queen and 1 single bed in the living area, good for 2 single men or women. \$165 per night, \$20 for 3rd person. (Families do use these on occasion). Views of mountains, 1 with mountain and sea.
- 2 x 2-bedroom units which have 3 beds in them, Queen in 1 bedroom, 2 singles in other. Tariff \$190 for 2, extra \$20 per person (up to 4). These also have kitchenettes. Views of mountains, 1 with mountain and sea.
- 1 x 2 bedroom 2 single beds in 1 bedroom, 1 queen and single in other and bed in lounge area. Tariff \$190 for 2, extra \$20 per person (up to 5) Kitchenette.

The history behind the car:

On the way home from the Lord Nelson Central Otago Tour I stopped off in Geraldine to look at a 1938 Standard Speedster that was advertised on TradeMe. She ticked all the right boxes, and I could see real potential as a winter garage project as my garage at Olive Estate has space for 3 cars. First thoughts were to drive her back to Nelson but on a freezing morning it became obvious that with little or no brakes and a slipping clutch the Lewis Pass was not achievable, so she was left in Christchurch awaiting a salvage trailer pickup.

She is based on a 1938 Standard chassis with 1934 Chev wheels, powered by a 1963Triumph 2000 TC motor and gearbox. Body is lightweight aluminium panels, and she was well constructed by a Levin enthusiast who evidently built a few Austin 7 specials. Roy McGuinness who sold Classic Cars in Petone owned her for 40 years and did VCC Rallies, track days and winter mudplugs on Landcruiser wheels. Despite a hard life she is in excellent order with the potential to become a pretty Cafe speedster. She is warranted and registered which is a godsend and the motor has heaps of torque and runs sweet as a nut.

Stage 1 was to strip off all the paint with Coopers paint stripper and polish the body panels. Wheels have been powder coated and balanced, engine painted plus wiring rerouted and tidied. Ugly mudguards have been replaced with Harley Davidson steel guards which are to be wrapped in Aluminium body wrap along with the fuel tank. Side steps will be aluminium deck tread and aluminium roll bars will balance the overall effect. The 1930 Singer Bantam radiator mascot has moved to the fuel cap. A 1920s Ford Model T handbrake will be mounted on the outer body and will pass over the side mounted exhaust terminating in a fish tail pipe. Old 1940s Ford V8 over-riders have become rear bumperets and stone guards protect the oversized headlights.

AliExpress and Temu have been regular callers with the Courier stating that almost 50% of his deliveries are from them. The windscreen is way too tall so will be lowered or replaced with Aero screens. It's great to have a garage project again after building Choyse the 1955 MGTF replica which is now in Whangarei as a well-loved memorial to a young Chinese girl who was murdered in Auckland a couple of years ago.

Hello All Members

BOOKING SYSTEMS

Many Restaurants and Cafes are now insisting that bookings are confirmed some days prior to attending their establishment. Further they may well insist that even if you do not attend that the meal is to paid for.

This has come about due to them having to order and have on hand enough food for the numbers booked and also have enough staff on hand to provide the service.

They will often have to throw out unused food and pay staff even if people don't show.

On this basis the club, for many functions, may require you to:

- 1. Confirm your booking/attendance by a given date prior to the event.
- 2. If required, either pay a deposit or the full amount prior to the date specified.
- 3. If you decide to cancel after the given date, prior to the event, there will in all probability, be no refund.
- 4. If you decide after the given date, prior to the event, that you wish to attend then in all probability you will be excluded.
- 5. If you just show up to attend any function with out confirming booking/attendance then your participation will be at the discretion of the establishment we are attending. Please do not be offended if you are excluded.
- 6. If the club is subsidising the cost of the event and you do not attend without notifying the club by the given date, prior to the event then you may well be required to refund the club the subsidised amount. This is because the club will be having to pay for your participation in the event even though you do not attend and this results in a direct loss to the club and its members.

When required please ensure your payment is made to the **CORRECT** account specified.






