Message from Sonja regarding Club Notices


Club Email Notifications by Mailchimp

Thanks to everyone who has sent me their contact details. I am working through them all to update the list but I have a wee problem as work gets in the way.

If you change your email address, postal address and phone number, please let me know so I can update our records. I have had requests from a couple of members to send the emails to 2 different email address (His and Hers \bigcirc), just send me an email and I can set this up for you.

I have noticed that a number of the members might not be receiving the email notifications that have been sending out. I get a report showing how many have received and opened the emails.

To The Top and Back Classic Marathon

4th- 15th September 2022

Every second year since 1996 the Christchurch based Classic Motoring Society of New Zealand has conducted its Marathon Classic Motoring tour.

The 2022 Staging will be the 14th such event and we welcome your participation. The tour will commence in Whanganui on Sunday the 4th of September and finish 12 days later in Masterton on the 15th of September The tour will be run over a mixture of tarmac and gravel roads, The entry fee includes a bus excursion from Kaitaia to Cape Reinga via 90 Mile Beach, entry to a vehicle display, and three group dinners. The tour does not have a competitive aspect and is conducted over open public roads giving our participants the opportunity to explore some roads they would not normally use.

Eligible vehicles:

As with all CMSNZ tours it is open to vehicles of all types and all ages. Our aim is to provide a classic motoring experience with like-minded people.

General Information:

The Classic Marathon is not a competitive event in any sense. You are encouraged to fully participate, interact, and enjoy yourselves. A route book will guide you if you choose to follow the plotted route, but the navigation is not designed to get you lost! It is designed to get you to the next night's accommodation.

Drinking and driving do not mix.

Drivers are required to uphold a high standard of driving skill, courtesy, and compliance with road rules at all times. We remind all participants that drinking, and driving do not mix. There will be time enough for socialising.

Courtesy:

This particularly includes allowing faster cars to pass on gravel and dusty road sections. Likewise, overtaking drivers must pay high regard to the welfare of other tour members and road users and their cars.

The tour will not include a "Tail End Charlie". So, all participants must be able to service, repair or repatriate their own vehicles. We expect all entrants to provide assistance to any other entrant where they can

Registration of Interest and Entry:

Please understand that if you fill out and send in your entry form, it does not mean a guaranteed acceptance to participate in the tour because the committee may have already accepted the maximum number of applicants. Should your entry not result in acceptance to attend the tour, your entry fee will be fully refunded, and any supplied documentation returned.

Once the Marathon number has been allocated the fee is non-refundable (unless we are able to find a replacement for your position in the tour).

Fees and Refunds:

Tour participants are responsible for their own costs. This includes meals (excluding the three tour dinners) and beverages, accommodation, personal and vehicle expenses, and running expenses such as fuel and chocolate.

Entry Fees:

\$755 per car and two people. If not already a member of the CMSNZ or Classic Motoring Nelson a \$25 joining fee also needs to be included. Additional persons are \$355 per person.

Checklist of things to do/include:

- Member of CMSNZ -or Member of CMS Nelson, if not add \$25 subscription fee to entry cost
- Confirm vehicle/s insurance
- Confirm a valid, up to date New Zealand or International driver's license/s are held for all drivers
- Vehicle fully registered and roadworthy for the event
- Entry form fully completed and signed and sent to CMSNZ for their records
- Booked Accommodation

Eligibility for the Marathon:

Any vehicle considered by the tour committee to be a "classic" regardless of age, country of origin, etc. may be entered. Vehicles must be capable of motoring up to 400 km a day. All vehicles are required to be registered and in possession of a valid WOF at the time and duration of the Marathon.

To achieve the aims of the Marathon, the tour committee reserve the right not to accept any and every entry. Membership of The Classic Motoring Society of New Zealand or the Nelson Classic Motoring Society is a prerequisite to be considered for participation in the Marathon, hence the \$25 subscription.



Recent Events

Sunday 10th April run



Members in 27 Classic Cars enjoyed a beautiful sunny calm Autumn Sunday afternoon run with a stop off at the Kohatu Café for refreshments. The Run travelled through the Moutere and Rosedale Saddle to cross the Motueka River on the Peninsula Swing Bridge, along the West Bank and back across the Baton Bridge and on through Tapawera to Kohatu.

Thursday 28th April - Autumn Drive

Five cars assembled on this sunny day to enjoy the autumn colours along the 85-kilometre drive. The route took us through Richmond East joining SH^ at the junction of Clover Road East and Lightband Road. At Brightwater we turned into Lord Rutherford Road South and re-joined SH6 via Bird Road. 












Thursday 26th May - Golden Bay Trip
